 Students have been doing well with homework completion, and the new format of reading log appears to be working well. A special thank you to Mrs. Robinette for donating her time and effort into creating it for our class; it was greatly appreciated!

ELA Tip:

Encourage your child to choose books they are interested in reading. Students often become frustrated when they are forced to read a book they don't find interesting, and can begin to dislike reading.

Finding a series of books that a child likes, or even books with similar storylines can help motivate students to strive to read more.
